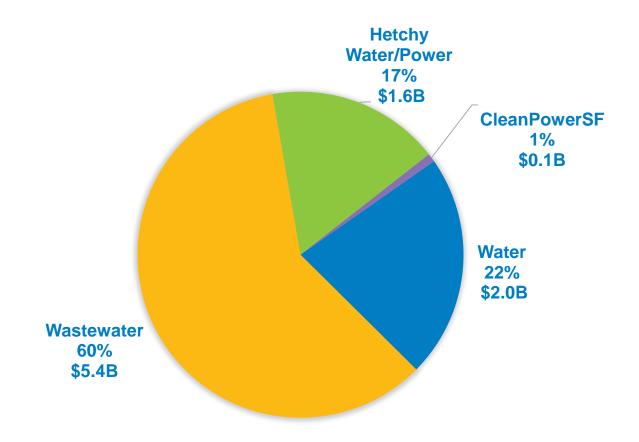


10-Year Capital Plan Development

- Annual public hearings required by Charter Section 8B.123 to review, update and adopt Long-Term Capital Plan
- Capital Plan provides: assessment of SFPUC's capital needs, investments required to meet those needs, and plan to finance them
- Prior approved update in February 2020 a part of comprehensive two-year budget
- Only critical capital changes included in this update
- Next comprehensive review of capital needs Fall 2021

Wastewater Enterprise Highlights FY22-31

Sewer System Improvement Program

- 12 projects awarded \$1,715 million in State and Federal funds
- Biosolids Digester Facilities Project \$714 million
- Treatment \$807 million
- Collection System \$864 million
- Stormwater Management and Flood Resilience \$695 million

R&R

- Collection System \$1,566 million
- Treatment Plants \$334 million

Facilities and Infrastructure

Non-SSIP capital projects - \$373 million



SEP Biosolids Digester Facilities Project

Project Cost: \$1,680 million

Scope: New solids processing facilities

Progress and Status:

- Scope 1 reached substantial completion relocation of existing utilities and demolition of existing buildings are complete
- Scope II NTP issued on July 1, 2020
- Excavation and pile Installation currently underway
- Closure of Jerrold Ave. to facilitate safe construction – Jan 4, 2021

Yosemite Green Infrastructure

Project Cost: \$17 million

Scope: Daylight the historic creek path, from Yosemite Marsh in McLaren Park to

Woolsey and Hamilton Streets

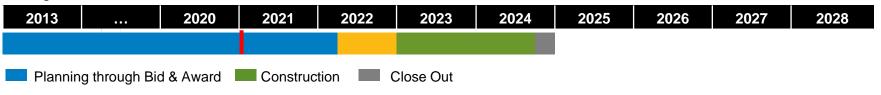
Progress and Status:

- Development of an RFP for green infrastructure engineering services is anticipated to be issued Q3 FY20-21
- Design and construction
 Memorandum of Understanding with
 the San Francisco Recreation & Park
 Department is under development

Renewal and Replacement (R&R)

Treatment Facilities:

- R&R Treatment Program extends the useful life of WWE facility assets
- Projects prioritized based on safety, regulatory compliance, condition assessments, Operation staff recommendations and Levels of Service Goals
- We expect an increase in annual investment

Collection System:

- Goal to award 15 miles of R&R main sewer replacement per year
- Complete Spot Sewer replacement at 700-1000 locations per year in future cycles of investment
- Continue trend towards trenchless technology



Ocean Beach Climate Change Adaptation Project

Project Cost: \$170 million

Scope: Shoreline management and protection against bluff erosion and climate-change induced sea level rise south of Sloat Boulevard

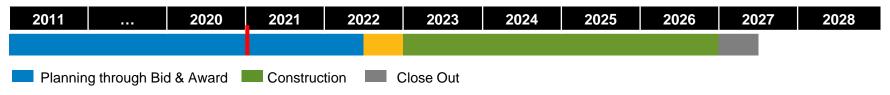
Progress and Status:

- 35% Design Phase completed, 65% initiated
- Completed Administrative Draft Environmental Impact Report
- Funding negotiations continue, SF Zoo and CCSF partner agencies for non-SFPUC project components – estimated value \$35M+

Regional

- Alternative Water Supplies \$265 million
- Water Treatment Improvements \$272 million
- Dam Safety Measures \$75 million
- New Laboratory and Offices in Millbrae \$140 million

Local

- Main Replacements \$446 million
- New Services \$82 million
- Potable Emergency Firefighting Water System \$43 million
- Lead User Service Line Identification and Replacement \$34 million
- New City Distribution Division HQ at 2000 Marin \$335 million

- Mountain Tunnel Rehabilitation \$118 million
- Moccasin Rewind and Transformers \$34 million
- Transmission Lines \$58 million
- Moccasin Powerhouse Bypass \$14 million
- Kirkwood Powerhouse Bypass \$15 million
- Dam Safety Measures \$305 million
